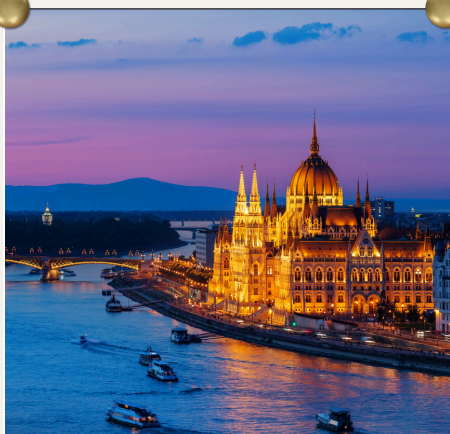

With its unique blend of history, culture, and modern attractions, Budapest offers an unforgettable experience for every visitor.



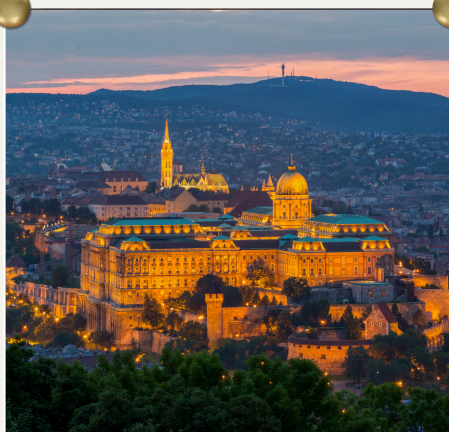

DAY ONE

Start your first day by visiting the most famous cultural and historical sights of Budapest. The following list is in order by location, so you can make the best of your day.

Visit the Buda Castle and Castle District

Going up to the Castle District, you should opt for the funicular. Explore the Castle District! Get lost, explore the narrow streets.



The most famous sights are Fisherman's Bastion, Church of Mary Magdalene, Matthias Church, Red Hedgehog House (Budapest's oldest building, located on 1011 Hess András tér 3.) and Tóth Árpád sétány. Inside the Buda Castle, you can find the Hungarian National Gallery, Széchényi Library and the Hungarian Historical Museum. Programs at Castle District are the Buda Labyrinth and the Hospital under the Rock. You can enter the Labyrinth system at Úri utca 9. Note that there is an entrance fee.

Hungarian Parliament

By metro, you can cross the Danube underground and visit the most famous Hungarian landmark, the Parliament. There is a visitor centre on-site. You can enjoy the views from Kossuth Lajos tér and eat a dessert at Szamos Cafe or visit the banks of Danube.

St. Stephen Basilica

In a short 10-15-minute walk, you will get to one of Budapest's most significant churches. The basilica is dedicated to the holy king St. Stephen who was the founder of the Hungarian state. Visiting the building itself is partly free. Near the Basilica, there is Deák Ferenc tér, a famous and lively hub of the city centre.

Andrássy út, Hősök tere and Vajdahunyad Castle

Andrássy út is Hungary's Champs-Élysées. At the end of Andrássy út you will find Heroes Square. It is a memento of the Hungarian historical figures and the state foundation. Next to Heroes Square you can find to the left, the Museum of Fine Arts and to the right, the Institution of the Hungarian Academy of Arts. Behind Heroes Square you will find the largest park of Budapest, the Városliget.

Here is the Vajdahunyad Castle, Széchenyi Bath, the Városliget Lake, The House of Hungarian Music, the Museum of Ethnography and Budapest Zoo.

Take a walk around, relax, and enjoy the rest of your day!

> THE GARDEN OF PHILOSOPHERS

This park is tucked away in the near vicinity of the famous Gellért Hill and the Citadel – but the views are the same! Quiet, beautiful and cozy, this place is the perfect start to your day.



> GELLÉRT HILL AND THE CITADEL

Of course, you won't miss the famous sights either. You can walk through the hills or take the bus to get here from the Garden of Philosophers. Gellért Hill offers beautiful views, one of the most famous ones you can get at Budapest. You can visit the Citadel for an entrance fee, but the walk through the hill's forests and parks is free. There are playgrounds for the children's amusement too.



> CAVE CHURCH

This church is one of a kind in Budapest and Hungary. The Cave Church is carved into the Gellért Hill, with its pavilion overlooking the Danube and the Pest side. You can visit the church outside of mass hours for an entrance fee.
